

## Los Angeles/Sister Cities Visiting Journalists Fellowship

#### **Program Description**

The Sister Cities program was created in 1956 by U.S. President Dwight D. Eisenhower to strengthen relationships between U.S. and international cities, with the hope that these relationships would foster trade, cultural and educational exchange, and, ultimately, mutual understanding and appreciation, thereby lessening the chance of future world conflicts. Los Angeles began its Sister Cities program in 1959 with Nagoya, Japan, and now is engaged with 23 Sister Cities over six continents.

To advance the goals of the Sister Cities program, LA INC. The Los Angeles Convention and Visitors Bureau, launched the first Los Angeles/Sister Cities Visiting Journalist Fellowships program in 2006 to bring to Los Angeles journalists from media outlets serving LA's Sister Cities for a weeklong fellowship to learn firsthand about Los Angeles. The 2006 Fellowship included journalists from Japan, New Zealand, The People's Republic of China, and The Philippines.

Fellowships cover all lodging, meals and instruction for seven days. Airfare and travel expenses to and from Los Angeles will be covered up to a maximum of U.S. \$1,500 for each fellow. Fellowship participation is limited to professional journalists employed by or freelancing for print or electronic media outlets located in or that serve one of Los Angeles' Sister Cities, including national media organizations.

Los Angeles' Sister Cities are: Athens, Greece; Auckland, New Zealand; Beirut, Lebanon; Berlin, Germany; Bordeaux, France; Busan, Korea; Eilat, Israel; Giza, Egypt; Guangzhou, People's Republic of China; Ischia, Italy; Jakarta, Indonesia; Kaunas, Lithuania; Lusaka, Zambia; Makati, Philippines; Mexico City, Mexico; Mumbai (formerly known as Bombay), India; Nagoya, Japan; Salvador de Bahia, Brazil; San Salvador, El Salvador; Split, Croatia; St. Petersburg, Russia; Taipei, Taiwan; and Vancouver, Canada.

--2006 Fellow Tanya Wan People's Republic of China Up to six fellowships will be awarded each year, following a competitive selection process. Applicants must be currently employed as professional journalists and have a minimum of three years of experience.

Fellowships are residential, and fellows are expected to attend all organized sessions as well as other related activities, stay in the host hotel and participate in organized meals. As part of the application process, fellows agree to share the knowledge they gain from the fellowship with colleagues at their news organizations when they return as well as with their readers, viewers or listeners.

The fellowships will be held May 12-21, 2007. Fellows are solely responsible for securing appropriate visas and any other government-required documentation and/or authorization to participate in this program.

## Los Angeles/Sister Cities Visiting Journalists Fellowship Application Instructions

The following material must be included in application packages to receive consideration:

- 1. **Completed application forms**. Both applicant and supervisor forms must be completed and signed.
- 2. Resume or curriculum vitae. Not to exceed three single-spaced pages.
- 3. **Personal Statement.** A personal statement of no more than 500 words (2 pages, single spaced) explaining how this Sister City Visiting Fellowship experience would benefit you, your news organization and your audience.
- 4. Letter of Recommendation. Your supervising editor or producer familiar with your work should provide a letter commenting on your abilities and potential as a journalist and also commit to pay your salary during the seminar (vacation time should not be taken to participate) as well as pay for any non-fellowship expenses such as room service, long distance phone calls, etc. Freelancers should submit a letter of assignment from a media outlet serving a Sister City.
- Samples of professional work. Submit three samples of your best work. The subject does not need to relate to Los Angeles or travel but should show your skill and ability to present a complex topic. Samples in languages other than English should include a translation. All samples should have been published or broadcast within the past five years.
  - **Print:** Samples need not be originals. Work should be submitted on standard 8.5-by-11-inch paper. Editors applying to the program should submit samples of projects they supervised and edited with a summary explanation of how the work was approached and the editor's philosophy of story management.
  - **Broadcast:** CD, DVD, cassette or VHS tapes up to 30 minutes in total running time should be sent along with supporting explanations as necessary.
  - Internet: Submit work samples either as printouts on paper or, if applicable, provide the URLs.
